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**ORDER:**

Telangana Medical Colleges (Admission into Postgraduate Medical Courses) Rules, 2017 have been reviewed, particularly in light of Hon'ble Supreme Court orders issued in W.P.(Civil) No.196/2018 dated 31.8.2020 and it has been decided to issue revised comprehensive rules in this regard restoring reservations to in-service candidates for admission into postgraduate courses.

Accordingly, the following notification shall be published in the extraordinary issue of the Telangana Gazette, dated:20-11-2021.

**NOTIFICATION**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section (3) read with sub-section (1) of section (15) of the Telangana Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act 1983 (Act No. 5 of 1983), and in supersession of the earlier rules, the Governor of Telangana hereby makes the following rules for admission into postgraduate broad specialty courses offered in government medical colleges, private non-minority medical colleges, private minority medical colleges in the 'Competent Authority Quota':

These rules are called the Telangana Medical Colleges (Admission into Postgraduate Medical Courses) Rules 2021.

**I. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:**

- i. Candidates should be citizens of India and should have completed MBBS course.
- ii. Candidates have to qualify National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) conducted by National Board of Examination.
- iii. The duration of Postgraduate Degree Courses is 3 years.
- iv. The duration of Postgraduate Diploma Courses is two years.

**II. NON-ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:**

- i. Candidates who are undergoing Postgraduate Degree/Diploma & DNB courses are not eligible to apply for any Postgraduate/Diploma & DNB courses.

**III. NUMBER OF SEATS:**

- i. The number of seats in postgraduate degree and diploma courses in the various broad specialties in each medical college shall be notified before counseling (after excluding 50% seats contributed to all India quota).

IV. RESERVATIONS:

- i. 15%, 6%, 29% of the total number of seats notified in each of postgraduate degree and diploma courses separately shall be reserved for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes respectively.
- ii. 20% of seats in postgraduate clinical broad specialties and 30% of the seats in postgraduate pre and para clinical broad specialties for degree and diploma courses are reserved for in-service candidates in **government medical colleges** under service quota which are horizontal reservations.
- iii. The reservations to SC, ST and BC categories shall be followed in service quota for postgraduate clinical and non-clinical broad specialties. The principle of reservation and merit needs to be followed for in-service candidates. Candidates selected on merit in respective category shall be however counted against service quota. Service rendered shall be calculated as per cut-off date specified by KNR University of Health Sciences.
- iv. Only candidates in government service who secure admission as per above provisions will be deemed to be in-service candidates.
- v.  $33\frac{1}{3}\%$  and 5% seats of postgraduate degree and diploma courses shall be reserved for women and for persons with disabilities (PWD) respectively which are also horizontal reservations.
- vi. 10% seats will be reserved for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) as per applicable rules. The said reservation will be implemented up on sanction of additional seats for the purpose of EWS reservation by NMC/DCI/Gol in specified colleges.

V. PREPARATION OF THE SEAT MATRIX: The KNR University of Health Sciences shall prepare the seat matrix for the Competent Authority Quota seats as per the guidelines given below:-

- i. The reservations to SC, ST and BC categories shall be 15%, 6% and 29% in each broad specialty.
- ii. The number of seats for SC, ST and BC categories shall be maintained as per reservations in each broad specialty.
- iii. The 29% of seats for BC category shall be distributed as BC-A 7%, BC-B - 10%, BC-C - 1%, BC-D 7% and BC-E 4%.
- iv. The seats for BC categories shall be allotted as per the sub group percentage of reservation limiting to 29%. In determining the number of seats for each sub group, the highest fraction shall be counted as one followed by the next highest one and so on.
- v. The reservations for BC category sub groups shall be maintained broad specialty wise as far as possible. When a seat cannot be earmarked for a sub-group, the seat shall be allotted to any BC sub group by merit.
- vi. When the number of seats in a broad specialty for BC category is 1 or 2, the BC category seats shall be allotted to any sub-group on merit.
- vii. When the number of BC seats in a broad specialty and in a college are 4 or more than 4 at least one seat shall be allotted to each sub group of BC category as per percentage of sub group reservation.
- viii. When the seats for all the BC category subgroups cannot be allotted in a college, the seats to sub groups shall be rotated among the colleges every year.
- ix. The available BC seats derived out of the total number of seats in each of Clinical Degree, Diploma, non-clinical Degree and Diploma shall be allotted to the BC category subgroups as per the % specified for them.

- x. When the number of seats earmarked for a BC sub-group is more than the actual seats for which they are eligible, the excess seats shall be allocated to the deficient BC category sub-group in subsequent counseling.
- xi. Candidates claiming admission under reserved category (SC, ST, BC) should submit all the relevant original certificates in person to the respective verification officers from the SC, ST, BC Welfare Departments respectively without fail at the notified time of verification of original certificates, otherwise their claim for reservation category admission will not be considered. The decision of concerned verifying officer is final for confirming the validity of caste certificate.
- xii. The Commissioner / Director, SC, ST, BC, Minority Welfare shall depute officers to the respective counseling centres in the State / States without fail on receipt of requisition from the Registrar, KNR UHS, Warangal. The verification officers deputed shall attend duties continuously at the counseling centre as per schedule, without fail. TA, DA and Honorarium will be paid by the University.
- xiii. 33 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub>% and 5% seats of postgraduate degree and diploma broad specialty courses shall be reserved for women and for persons with disabilities (PWD) respectively which are also horizontal reservations.
- xiv. The unreserved seats shall be calculated broad specialty course wise in the University area and shall be limited to each institution depending upon the number of seats in that broad specialty course and in that college.
- xv. The reservations shall also be maintained as far as possible for the unreserved quota seats also.
- xvi. When the number of unreserved seats is 2, one seat shall be reserved under OC category and one seat shall be rotated amongst SC, ST and BC categories in that order every year.
- xvii. Reservations to persons with disabilities (PWD): The reservations to persons with disabilities (PWD) shall be implemented in each category on the total number of seats for that category in clinical and non-clinical courses separately and the seats shall be rotated among the various broad specialty courses.
- xviii. KNR University of Health Sciences shall constitute a medical board comprising of professors of relevant clinical departments from government medical colleges including NIMS. The Medical Board shall evaluate the persons with disabilities (PWD) for assessment of percentage of disability as per the National Medical Commission guidelines. The decision of the medical board constituted by the University shall be final in all respects. The University will notify the list of eligible PWD candidates on the web-site for exercising options.

#### **VI. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR IN-SERVICE CANDIDATES:**

- i. The regular service candidates who have put in 2 years or more of service in tribal area / 3 years or more of service in rural area / 6 years or more of service in other areas are eligible for service quota reservation.
- ii. The candidates should have qualified in the NEET-PG examination as per the cut-off marks prescribed for different categories to be eligible for service quota reservations.
- iii. Temporary / contract / out sourcing candidates are not eligible for service quota reservations.
- iv. It is further clarified that in-service candidate means a candidate who has put in :
  - a. two years of continuous regular tribal service:
    - i. Tribal service means service in tribal institutions recognized by the Government of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.
  - b. three years of continuous regular rural service:

- i. Rural service means service in Primary Health Centres, Subsidiary Health Centres, Dispensaries, Taluk Hospitals, Mobile Medical Units, Leprosy Control Units or the sample survey-cum-Assessment units, under Leprosy Temporary hospitalization wards situated in Taluks and Leprosy Training Centre at Pogiri (G.O. Ms. No. 31 HM&FW (B2) Department, Dated: 11-2-1997).
- c. six years of continuous regular service:
  - i. Continuous regular service means regular services in the State of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh in the following services:
    - 1. Directorate of Medical Education.
    - 2. Directorate of Public Health & Family Welfare.
    - 3. Vaidya Vidhana Parishad
    - 4. Insurance Medical Service.
    - 5. Singareni Collieries
    - 6. Any other service notified by Government of Telangana.
- v. The candidates should serve in a Government Institutions as per the orders of State Government after completion of the course for a period of 10 years.
- vi. The candidate should have minimum left over service of 8 years for admission into PG degree and 7 years for PG diploma courses to be eligible for grant of study leave as service candidate. The cut-off date for calculation of left-over service will be notified by the University.
- vii. All persons seeking admission as in-service candidates shall submit applications online with details of service rendered by them in prescribed proforma, along with other certificates. The certificates have to be uploaded online.
- viii. Candidates shall submit eligibility service certificate issued only by the concerned Director of Medical Education, Director of Public Health & Family Welfare, the Director Insurance Medical Services, the Commissioner Vaidya Vidhana Parishad and other competent authority as notified by the Government, in the prescribed format appended to application at the time of online applications. Applications of the candidates who have not submitted the certificate from the respective Heads of the Department at the time of counseling or selection shall not be considered.
- ix. Grant of Study leave to in-service candidates selected for PG degree under service quota course shall be restricted to 3 years.
- x. If in- service candidate is selected under Service Quota for PG diploma course; the candidate will be given study leave for a period of 2 years.
- xi. The candidates selected to prosecute postgraduate courses shall be sanctioned study leave for not more than one course i.e either postgraduate degree or postgraduate diploma during his service.
- xii. In service candidate shall join the course on or before the commencement of the course after getting relieved from the concerned Head of the Institution. The Heads of the Medical Institution shall relieve them if they apply for relief enclosing a copy of the selection and allotment order issued by the Chairman, admission committee.

**VII. ELIGIBILITY FOR STUDY LEAVE WITH PAY & ALLOWANCES FOR IN-SERVICE CANDIDATES:-**

- i. Candidates who are undergoing Postgraduate Degree/Diploma /DNB courses are not eligible to apply for any Postgraduate/Diploma/DNB courses.
- ii. Candidates who have already completed a postgraduate degree/DNB are not eligible for admission to any other post graduate diploma/ degree/ DNB courses.

- iii. Candidates who have already completed a diploma course are not eligible to apply for another diploma course; but can apply for other postgraduate degree/DNB courses and are entitled for pay & allowances for total study duration (36months).
- iv. Study leave will be given for those in-service candidates who join PG course under in-service quota.
- v. The candidates selected to study Postgraduate courses shall be sanctioned study leave for not more than one course during service period.
- vi. If a candidate selected for PG Degree course, the candidate will be given study leave for a period of 3 years and for PG Diploma course study leave is given for a period of 2 years.
- vii. In-service candidate shall join the course on or before the commencement of the PG course after getting relieved from the concerned Head of the Institution. The Heads of the Medical Institution shall relieve them if they apply for relief enclosing a copy of the selection and allotment order issued by the Chairman, Admission Committee.
- viii. The candidate should have a minimum left over service of 8 years for degree and 7 years for diploma course to be eligible for grant of study leave as service candidate. The cut-off date for calculation of left-over service will be notified by the University.
- ix. The candidates who opt for the PG seats under in service quota should execute a bond that they will serve the state government after the completion of the course in any of the government institutions / departments as per Government orders for a period of 10 years and in case bond is violated the candidate must remit pay & allowances received during study period in addition to Rs.50 Lakh as penalty to the state government.

#### **VIII. RESERVATION IN FAVOUR OF THE LOCAL CANDIDATES**

- i. Admission to 85% of the seats shall be reserved in favour of the local candidates in relation to the local area as provided in Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulations of Admission) order 1974 as amended from time to time.
- ii. STATE WIDE COURSE: M.D. (RT) is State-wide course and admissions to this course shall be regulated as per the provisions in the Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission) order 1974 for State wide course and guidelines of AP State Re-organisation Act.

#### **IX. SELECTION PROCEDURE:**

- i. KNR University of Health Sciences will issue the notification for schedule of admission process i.e., submission of online application among the eligible NEET qualified candidates, verification of original certificates / certificates uploaded online and web-based counseling.
- ii. Selections will be done as per the counseling schedule notified by the University on website. Two phases of web based counseling shall be conducted and if vacancies arise after two phases of counseling, mop up counseling shall be conducted.
- iii. After two phases of counseling for service quota seats, the left over seats will be added to the respective categories of non-service seats.
- iv. The selections will be made course wise for PG Degree/Diploma broad specialty.
- v. As per the G.O. Ms. No. 42, the unreserved seats will be filled first and then the local seats.
- vi. Both local and non-local candidates are eligible for un-reserved seats.
- vii. First all the OC seats in a broad specialty in all the colleges shall be filled and then reserved category seats shall be filled.

- viii. A reserved category candidate selected under OC in a college in a broad specialty shall be permitted to slide into the same broad specialty to another college. The seat vacated shall be filled with the candidate of the same reserved category.
- ix. A reserved category candidate selected under OC in a college in a broad specialty shall be permitted to slide into another broad specialty. The seat vacated shall be filled with the OC candidate in the subsequent counseling treating the seat as OC.
- x. A reserved category candidate selected under OC and does not join the broad specialty, the said vacancy shall be treated as OC and shall be filled in the subsequent counseling.
- xi. A reserved category candidate selected under OC and slides into a category seat in another college and does not join in the broad specialty, the seat vacant under OC category shall be treated as OC and the category into which he has slid not joined shall be treated as respective category seat in the subsequent counseling.
- xii. Where a reserved category candidate slides to another college or broad specialty such seat vacated shall be filled by another reserved candidate of the same category.
- xiii. Provisional selection shall be made by the Admission Committee constituted by the KNR University of Health Sciences. The selection intimation shall be issued specifying the date by which the candidate has to report to the respective college.
- xiv. The Admission Committee shall display the allocation of seats category wise and college wise on the University website after each phase of web-based counseling.
- xv. The selected candidate shall submit the original certificates at the college by following due procedure as notified by the University.'
- xvi. The candidates shall submit required bond and shall pay the college fees/ tuition fee at their respective colleges on or before the date fixed for the same.
- xvii. The candidates who are selected and admitted to PG courses are not permitted to withdraw from the course after the last date for free exit as notified by the University on website before for final phase of web-based counseling by the University.
- xviii. The candidates who are selected for admission into PG courses (Competent Authority Quota, Management Quota, All India Quota) in the final phase of counseling including slided candidates (candidates who have joined in the previous phase of counseling) have to report for admission without fail to prevent wastage of seats and seat blocking. Otherwise, all such candidates will be debarred for three years for admission into Postgraduate Medical Degree /Diploma course in the state of Telangana besides payment of Rs.20,00,000=00 (Rupees Twenty lakhs only) towards forfeiture of bond.
- xix. If a candidate after allotment to the PG broad specialty course fails to pay the fees or after paying the fees fails to submit the bond, original certificates, the selection of such candidate shall stand cancelled automatically and the candidate will not be eligible for selection for the next phases of counseling.
- xx. Any person who obstructs the proceedings of the counseling or otherwise misbehaves or causes disturbance at the Admission Committee meetings or counseling centre and obstructs or causes obstruction to its peaceful functioning shall be liable for such disciplinary action as may be taken by the University.
- xxi. Vacancies after the 1st phase of counseling shall be filled by another phase of web-based counseling as per the schedule notified by the University on the website of the University.
- xxii. The Admission Committee shall have power to review the provisional selection in case of any errors, misrepresentation, fraud or gross injustice. In all matters relating to the selections and admissions, the decision of the Admission Committee shall be final and binding on the candidates and selections cannot be questioned after closure of admissions.

xxiii. Conversion Procedure: The following is the procedure for filling up of the unfilled SC, ST and BC seats under web-based counseling:

- a. All the unfilled female seats will be converted to general seats of the respective categories.
- b. The unfilled SC seats will be converted to ST
- c. All the ST candidates will be considered for these seats.
- d. The unfilled ST seats will be converted to SC
- e. All the SC candidates will be considered for these seats.
- f. All the above unfilled seats will be converted to OC seats.
- g. All the BC-A seats will be converted to BC-B
- h. All the BC-B candidates will be considered for these seats.
- i. The unfilled BC-B category seats will be converted to BC-C
- j. All the BC-C category candidates will be considered for these seats.
- k. The unfilled BC-C category seats will be converted to BC-D
- l. All the BC-D category candidates will be considered for these seats.
- m. The unfilled BC-D category seats will be converted to BC-E
- n. All the BC-E category candidates will be considered for these seats.
- o. The unfilled BC-E category seats will be converted to BC-A
- p. All the unfilled BC category seats will be converted to OC.
- q. All the merit list candidates will be considered for the converted OC seats.
- r. A seat vacated by reserved category candidates will be added to the OC category only and the seat will be filled up.
- s. The unfilled OC seats will be converted to OC unreserved seats.
- t. All the candidates will be considered for the seats irrespective of the local area.
- u. Any seats unfilled will be treated as not filled seats.

#### **X. COMMON COUNSELING FOR THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY QUOTA:**

As per the National Medical Commission regulations amended from time to time and as per the directions from the Ministry of Health Government of India, common counseling based on the merit of NEET-PG ranking will be conducted by the University for the Competent Authority Seats in all medical educational institutions established by Central Government/State Government/Deemed University/ Trust / Society or a Company/ Minority Institutions/ Corporation. This common counseling will be under the overall superintendence, direction and control of the State Government.

#### **XI. ADMISSION RULES:**

- i) The dates of admission of selected candidates will be the dates as communicated to them in the letter of selection.
- ii) All the candidates joining the Postgraduate degree or diploma course (Competent Authority Quota, Management Quota, All India Quota) should execute a bond on a non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 100/- value to ensure undertaking to complete prescribed period of training. In case of the default, such candidate shall pay an amount of Rs.20,00,000=00 (Rupees Twenty lakh only) to KNR University of Health Sciences.
- iii) The original certificates submitted by the candidates shall not be returned to the candidates till they complete their course of study and appear for the University Examination.
- iv) Attendance: Candidates selected to the various courses should be whole time student. Service candidates will have to apply for leave to prosecute study and required to produce the leave sanction order form the competent authority no later than three months after joining the course.

- v) Leave: (a) The Postgraduate students are eligible for 30 days leave in the academic year and they can avail a maximum of 10 days leave continuously at a time. If they avail more than 10 days leave at a time, the stipend shall be deducted proportionately. The balance of leave in an academic year if not availed, shall not be carried forward to the next academic year.

(b) Maternity Leave:

(i) Postgraduate students are eligible for maternity leave as per relevant Government orders. The period of study for the postgraduate course shall be extended equal to the leave period sanctioned.

(ii) In-service candidates are eligible for maternity leave as per G.O.Ms.No.152, Finance (FR-I) Department, Dated:04.05.2010. Accordingly, they are eligible for extension of study leave for the same period.

vi) Sanction of leave of absence beyond 3 months & termination of studentship:

Every candidate after his admission shall attend the classes (Theory, Practical and Clinical) on all the working days unless the candidate is granted leave of absence by the Principal. If a student absents continuously for a period of 91 days or more up to one year and seeks permission to attend the course after discontinuation, the candidate application in the prescribed proforma shall be forwarded to the Registrar with the recommendations of the Principal with requisite fees. If the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied with the reasons, he may grant leave of absence attaching such conditions, as he may be deemed necessary. Candidates who are absent for a continuous period of one year or more without permission, shall be deemed to have forfeited the admission into the course and the studentship shall stand cancelled without any future notice. University/National Medical Commission regulations from time to time are applicable in this regard.

- vii) Private practice: No postgraduate is allowed to do any private practice or consultation and should not accept any part time employment in any state or central or quasi-government or private organizations during the Post graduation.

- viii) Accommodation: Candidates selected are required to stay in hostel wherever accommodation is available.

- ix) College Regulations: Candidates are required to follow the rules and regulations of the college and should also abide by the regulations of the University. Under no circumstances they should have any correspondence with the higher authorities directly without prior permission of the Principal.

x) Fees:

- a) TUTION FEE: All the candidates selected are required to pay the tuition fee as notified by the Government at the time of admission. If any of the candidates who joined in a course is allotted to another Medical College the tuition fees paid by the candidate will be adjusted to the newly selected course/college. The tuition fee paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances.

- b) UNIVERSITY FEE: All the candidates selected are required to pay University Fee for the course as specified by the KNR University of Health Sciences at the time of admission by way of Demand Draft from Nationalized Banks drawn in favour of Registrar, KNR University of Health Sciences, payable at Warangal or through payment gateway as notified by university.

- xi) Stipends: Stipend will be payable to the Postgraduates as per National Medical Commission Regulations and Government orders. Candidates shall be regular in attendance and show good progress every month. The total period for which the students are paid stipend shall not exceed 36 months for a Degree course and 24 months for a Diploma course.



- xii) Closure of Admissions:
- a) The admissions shall be closed as per the National Medical Commission schedule as notified by the University.
  - b) Any vacancy arising after the closure of admissions shall not be filled up.
- xiii) Duration of course:
- a) The duration of Postgraduate degree and diploma courses are for 3 years and 2 years respectively. No exemptions shall be given from the above period of training either for doing housemanship or any other experience or service or diploma.
  - b) A candidate registered for MD / MS Degree Examinations should clear the Examinations within 4 years of date of completion of the course and the candidate registered for a P.G. Diploma Course should clear Examinations within 2 years from the date of completion of the course. If the candidate fails to pass the examinations within the period specified above, the candidate shall not be allowed to appear for the examinations thereafter and qualify for the award of PG Degree or PG Diploma.
- xiv) Commencement of Course:
- The course shall commence as per National Medical Commission schedule as notified by the University. The duration of course shall be calculated from the date of commencement of the course.
- xv) Mutual Transfers or Transfers:
- Transfers including mutual transfers from one PG course to other or one college to other college are not permitted for any reason or under any circumstances as per National Medical Commission regulations.
- xvi) Power of the principals of the medical colleges:
- Notwithstanding anything contained in the said rules, the Principals of Medical Colleges in the state may at any time before completion of the Postgraduate course either on their own or on the application from any person after due and proper enquiry and after giving the person 2 weeks time from the date of receipt of the show cause notice to submit written explanation and on a personnel hearing, order cancellation of admission to the 1st year Postgraduate degree or diploma courses, if in their opinion such a candidate had furnished fraudulent or incorrect particulars in the application form or in the document attached thereto or in the statements made either before the authority in charge of admission or the Principal or in any of their manner. Against any such order of the Principal and appeal will lie with the Registrar, KNR University of Health Sciences, Warangal.
- xvii) Powers of University of Health Sciences:
- a. The KNR University of Health Sciences may either suo-moto or on representation made to university can call for and examine the records relating to admission made by the Admission Committee. University is entitled to cancel the admission if any irregularity is established. The University of Health Sciences before cancelling such selection of admission shall give an opportunity to Admission Committee and to the individual affected to show cause against such cancellation
- XII. All postgraduates (excluding in-service candidates) shall serve the Government of Telangana, if necessary, in Government institutions for a period of one year as per the orders of the State Government. A bond of Rs.10,00,000 (Rupees ten lakhs only) on admission into postgraduate diploma course and Rs.20,00,000 (Rupees twenty lakhs only) on admission into postgraduate degree course shall be executed by candidates at the time of admission.

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ORDER:

The Registrar, Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Telangana in the letter 6<sup>th</sup> read above, has proposed certain amendments to The Telangana Medical Colleges (Admission into Postgraduate Medical Courses) Rules, 2021 issued in the G.O. third read above in view of the completion of 10 years period after formation of Telangana State.

2. Section 95 of the Andhra Pradesh Reorganization Act, 2014 (Central Act No.6 of 2014). provides that the existing admission quotas in all Government or Private, aided or unaided, Institutions of higher, technical and medical education in so far as it is provided under article 371-D of the Constitution, shall continue as such for a period of ten years during which the existing common admission process shall continue.
3. Consequent upon expiry of the period of ten years provided in section 95 of the Andhra Pradesh Reorganization Act 2014, by 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2014, the Government, after careful examination of the matter, have decided to amend the Telangana Medical Colleges (Admission into Postgraduate Medical Courses) Rules, 2021 issued vide G.O. third read above.
4. Accordingly the following notification shall be published in the Telangana Gazette, Dated:29.10.2024.

**NOTIFICATION**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 read with sub-section (1) of section 15 of the Telangana Educational Institutions (regulation of Admission and Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1983 (Act no.5 of 1983), the Government of Telangana hereby make the following amendments to the Telangana Medical Colleges (Admission into Postgraduate Medical Courses) Rules, 2021 issued vide G.O. Ms. No.155, HM&FW (C1) Dept, dated 18.11.2021, and as subsequently amended from time to time:-

AMENDMENT

In the said rules,

- (1) in Rule IV, for sub-rule (i), the following shall be substituted: namely:-  
“(i) 15%, 10% and 29% of the total number of seats notified in each of postgraduate degree and diploma courses separately shall be reserved for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes respectively”.
- (2) In Rule V,
  - (a) for sub-rule (i), the following shall be substituted namely:-  
“(i) The reservations to SC, ST and BC categories shall be 15%, 10% and 29% in each broad specialty”.
  - (b) sub-rules (xiv), (xv) and (xvi) shall be deleted”.
- (3) In Rule VI, for sub-rule (iv), the following shall be substituted namely:-  
“(iv) It is further clarified that ‘in-service candidate’ means, a candidate who has put in
  - (a) two years of continuous regular service in tribal areas.

Tribal service means service located in tribal areas institutions recognized by the Government of Telangana.

(b) three years of continuous regular rural service

“Rural service means service rendered in Primary Health Centres, Subsidiary Health Centres, Dispensaries, Taluk Hospitals, Mobile Medical Units, Leprosy Control Units or the sample survey-cum-Assessment units, under Leprosy Temporary hospitalization wards situated in Taluks and Leprosy Training Centre in Telangana”.

(c) six years of continuous regular service:

“Continuous regular service’ means regular services in the State of Telangana in the following services:-

- (1) Directorate of Medical Education.
- (2) Directorate of Public Health & Family Welfare.
- (3) Telangana Vaidya Vidhana Parishad
- (4) Insurance Medical Service.
- (5) Singareni Colliceries
- (6) Any other service notified by Government of Telangana”.

(4) In Rule VIII, for sub-rules (i) and (ii) the following shall be substituted namely:-

(i) A candidate to be eligible for admission into P.G. Medical courses under these rules should be an Indian National/Person of Indian Origin/Overseas Citizen of India Card Holder and be a Local candidate.

(ii) ‘Local candidate’ means a candidate who has studied in the educational institutions in the State of Telangana for a period of not less than four (04) consecutive years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or as the case may be, first appeared in the relevant qualifying examination subject to:

**Explanation (a):** A candidate who is regarded as a Local Candidate for the purpose of admission to Undergraduate (MBBS) in the State of Telangana, but has studied in a State-wide Institutions outside the State of Telangana, shall also be regarded as a Local Candidate.

**Explanation (b):** A candidate, who has secured admission to the relevant Undergraduate Course (MBBS) under Non-Local Quota in the State of Telangana, shall not be regarded as a Local Candidate.

(5) In Rule IX, sub-rules (v) and (vi) shall be deleted.

(6) In Rule IX, in sub-rule (xxiii), clauses (s) and (t) shall be deleted.

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ORDER:

In the G.O. 1st read above, orders were issued for fixation of fee structure for PG medical and dental courses for the block period of 2020-2023 for the private unaided non-minority/minority medical and dental colleges in the State.

2. In the reference 2nd read above, Telangana Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee (TAFRC) has submitted proposal for fixation of fee structure of PG medical and dental courses for the block period of 2023-2026 for the private unaided non-minority / minority medical and dental colleges in the State.

3. Government after examination of the matter, hereby accept the recommendations of the TAFRC and fix the fee structure for PG medical and dental courses for the block period 2023-2026 as appended to this order as Annexure-I & II for the private unaided non-minority/minority medical and dental colleges in the state.

4. The following conditions shall be followed by all the private unaided non-minority / minority medical and dental colleges in the state:-

- (i) Tuition fee is payable annually.
- (ii) The students who were admitted to the course prior to the academic year 2023-24 shall continue to pay every year the same annual fee at the rate existing at the time of their admission till they complete the Course.
- (iii) The Institutions shall collect the annual tuition fee every year in advance only for that particular year either in lumpsum or in installments, if it so opts.
- (iv) The Management of the Institution may seek Bank Guarantee for tuition fee chargeable for the next academic year.
- (v) The Management of the Institution shall not charge any Capitation fee and there shall not be any profiteering. Except the above Fee fixed by the Committee, no other amount, either directly or indirectly, can be charged unauthorisedly or illegally by the Management. If any such other amount is charged under any other head or guise (e.g. donation etc) it would amount to charging of Capitation fee. The surplus (profit) that is generated from the collection of the fee must be for the benefit of the Institution and cannot be diverted for other purposes or for personal gain.
- (vi) The management shall pay stipend to the students on par with government institutions as per national medical commission regulations.

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5. The Registrar, KNR University of Health Sciences, Warangal, the Principals of all the private unaided non-minority / minority medical and dental colleges in the State shall take necessary action in the matter accordingly.
